

# SKOKHOLM ISLAND BIRD MIGRATION WEEKEND

Friday 11<sup>th</sup> – Monday 14<sup>th</sup> September 2015

A unique 3-day trip to this famous island, Britain's first Bird Observatory, at the peak of autumn migration. The total cost of the trip is just £219, which includes:

- ❖ A unique opportunity to see Manx Shearwaters come to shore under cover of darkness, as well as juvenile Manx Shearwaters and Storm Petrels in the hand as part of the island's groundbreaking scientific research

The return boat trip is payable to the boat operator on the day (£25 return). Species seen during this period in the past on Skokholm include Red-backed Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Ortolan Bunting, Icterine Warbler, Melodious Warbler, Barred Warbler, Bluethroat, Corncrake, Tawny Pipit & Wryneck. Any of these, and many others, could be seen during this trip!
